rof. G.K. Chadha [CEO, South Asian University (of SAARC Countries), New Delhi and Member of the Economic Advisory Committee to the Prime Minister of India visited the NTS Headquarters at CIIL, Mysore on 9th March.

During his brief visit, he interacted with the academic staff of NTS. Prior to this, the academic activities undertaken by the Centre for Testing & Evaluation (CT&E) through its project Multipurpose Indian Languages Evaluation System (MILES), and also through the Central Scheme of MHRD National Testing Service-India were explained by Prof. Pon Subbiah, the Head of CT&E and NTS-I. He also gave a briefing about the initiatives taken up by the CT&E for evolving a comprehensive basis required for the maintenance of comparability across courses, institutions, and individuals as a step towards achieving equality in education.

While addressing the NTS staff Prof. Chadha emphasized the need for working out a better system of evaluation that could be made applicable for the whole country. He felt that the teachers should equip themselves with various techniques of evaluation with proper insights. On stressing the need for dissemination of information he said that the work being done here should be made known to the outside world. He suggested that

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NTS should play a key role for improving the quality of education in the country and advised the NTS team to visit various universities for creating awareness on this aspect. He further suggested that the adaptation of all the scientific methods that are available across the globe should be ensured for achieving this endeavour of national importance. He pointed out that though India was doing well in higher education, it was not enough when compared to other developed countries.

Prof. Chadha was of the view that the methods of teacher evaluation should be incorporated in the NTS framework and expected the NTS to come up with a standardized way of developing it. He also opined that in future the NTS should emerge as an independent institution well versed in this field of testing and evaluation. Expressing that, as a well-wisher and supporter, he would be very happy to talk about this scheme anywhere and promised to try his best to get the subject of testing and evaluation recognised as an independent discipline in upcoming universities.

Reacting to a query during interactive session, he told that the agency like NTS only could bring the comparability in standards across various boards, universities, and other academic organizations. He lauded that Prof. Subbiah and his team was doing a good job at a time when the education sector in India was poised for phenomenal growth. He believed that it was in the hands of institutions like NTS to ensure the development of a scientific system of evaluation for maintaining quality with pace. He assured all support and cooperation for the NTS in going forward with this mission.

At the beginning of the programme Prof. Udaya Narayana Singh (Director, CIIL) introduced the guest to the audience. Prof. A. S. Dasan (Department of English, University of Mysore) welcomed the gathering. Dr. M. Balakumar (Coordinator, Programmes) and other staff of the NTS were present in the interactive session. Mr. M. Sarayana, SRP, NTS proposed the vote of thanks.

IV Phase of the Workshop on Concept based Continuum of Graded Syllabi (CCGS)

3rd to 7th & 26th to 28th March 2009: This programme, organised in two parts was conducted at the NTS headquarters Mysore. The objective was to finalize the dimensions associated with the sub components of language. In the first part of this programme, an attempt was made to identify the dimensions associated with various components of language. The technical terms that refer to the dimensions were defined with illustrative examples. Also the feedback was obtained for enriching a portion of the CCGS material already available. In its second part, the identified dimensions were demarcated and distributed across the seven levels of general education i.e., Primary to Research, where language is taught as a subject of study.

The scholars who participated in the workshop were Prof. Lakshmi Narayana Aurora (Former Director, Prasaranga, University of Mysore), Prof. C. Shunmugom (Former HOD of Linguistics, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore), Mr. Suryanarayana Begur (Former Principal, NIE, Mysore), Prof. M. Susheela (Former HOD of Linguistics, Tamil University,

Thanjavur), Dr. K. Pasumpon (Asst. Director of Tamil Development, Madurai), and Dr.A.Srinivasan (St. Joseph's College of Edn., Mysore).

Current Activities

Preparation of Testing Tools for Language Communication at Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, TN

9th to 11th March 2009: This three day workshop was jointly organized by the Centre for Testing and Evaluation (CT&E), CIIL, Mysore and Department of Extension and Career Guidance, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore at the latter's premises. The objective of this programme was to prepare testing tools for evaluating the communication skills (at the graduate level) that are usually expected by various agencies offering employment. Senior scholars including Dr. M. Ganesan (Prof. of Linguistics, Annamalai University), Dr. S. Radhakrishnan (Prof. of Translation, Tamil University, Thanjavur), Dr. N. Nadaraja Pillai (Controller of Exams., CIIL, Mysore) and Dr. L. Ramamoorthy (RRO, CIIL, Mysore) were involved in the activities of the first day of the programme.

On the second day i.e., 10th March, Dr. M. Balakumar (RRO, CIIL) and Dr. Biresh Kumar (RP, NTS) explained the item types available for the preparation of tools for language communication. They also informed the participants about the activities of the National Testing Service-India in this direction. Altogether there were 42 participants comprising college teachers and researchers. All of them were assigned the task of preparing question items under the areas allotted to them. The items to be identified as reasonably good will be considered for inclusion in the NTS database. The third day of the programme was devoted for consolidating the progress made by various participants. Prof. M. Jayakumar (HOD of Extension and Career Guidance, and Coordinator of the programme) presented the outcome of the programme in a consolidated form. He expressed his gratitude to Prof. Udaya Narayana Singh (Director, CIIL) and Prof. Pon Subbiah (Head, CT&E and DD, CIIL) for providing academic as well as financial support for organizing this programme.

Restructuring of Syllabi for Undergraduate Courses at Karnatak University, Dharwad

20th to 22nd March 2009: A three day workshop on restructuring the syllabi of undergraduate courses was jointly organized by CT&E, CIIL, Mysore and Institute of Kannada Studies, Karnatak Unviersity, Dharwad from 20th to 22nd March, 2009 at the latter's premises.

The programme was inaugurated by Prof. G. S. Amur, a renowned scholar of Kannada Literature. Keynote address was delivered by Prof. Pon Subbiah (Head, CT&E and NTS-I). He explained the importance of a syllabus document and the need for restructuring the traditionally developed ones in context of improving evaluation, as has been advocated by the NTS-I. Prof. H. M. Maheshwaraiah (Chairman, Institute of Kannada Studies) presided over the function and Prof. K.R. Durgadas

There were 12 academic sessions and 21 scholars / researchers attended the programme. All of them presented their views on restructuring the syllabi. The use of language technology in preparing the syllabi was discussed while giving importance to the traditional topics like poetry, drama, novel, short story, etc. Each session was led by a senior subject expert. Prof. Giraddi Govindaraj (eminent critic of Kannada Literature) presided over the valedictory session. Prof. B. Krishna Murthy (Member of Syndicate, Karnatak University) was the chief guest. Prof. Mulla (Head, Department of Foreign Languages, Karnatak University) and Dr. M. Balakumar (RRO, CIIL & Programme Co-ordinator) were present on the dias. While proposing vote of thanks Prof. K.R. Durgadas expressed his gratitude to CT&E and the CIIL for extending academic and financial support to hold this programme.
