The new website of the National Testing Service-India <u>www.ciil-ntsindia.net</u> was officially launched by Dr. Anita Bhatnagar Jain, Joint Secretary (Languages), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi on July 15, 2010 at 3.30 pm in the conference hall of CIIL, Mysore. It was dedicated to the nation on the occasion of the 42<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of CIIL, wherein all its former

Directors viz., Prof. D.P.Pattanayak, Prof.E.Annamalai, Prof. N.Ramaswami, Prof. O.N.Koul, Prof. U.N.Singh and the present incharge Prof. Rajesh Sachdeva were present along with a host of academic luminaries from all over the country and members / researchers of the CIIL faculty. The session was chaired by Prof. E.Annamalai.

In his briefing to the august audience, Prof. Pon Subbiah, Dean, School of Language Pedagogy, CIIL (who is also Head of the Centre for Testing & Evaluation and NTS-I) provided the details of the website scripted & formulated (by him) as one of the mouth pieces of NTS for disseminating information, apart from a monthly newsletter. A special mention was also made about the National Level Language Tests which were recently conducted across the country in three languages, as a *pilot study* for evolving *local* and *regional* norms at the two crucial levels (higher secondary and graduate).

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The size of the website is 1.5 GB. It has 13 *main* links and 5 *sub* links apart from many *hyperlinks*. There are separate links for *Research & Development* (R&D), *Survey & Documentation* (S&D), and *Consultancy & Training* (C&T). Also, there are full-fledged links earmarked for providing the details of *Regional Field Units* (locations, functions, etc.), the award of *fellowships* for doctoral & post doctoral research scholars, and the *grant of financial*

*assistance* under NTS-GIA. It has got a provision to highlight the details of the training programmes, workshops, seminars, etc., being organised by the NTS from time to time under R&D, S&D, and C&T. A number of *application formats* have also been uploaded with download options for the benefit of those who want to formally associate with NTS activities. The website has been designed as an *interactive* one, and the viewers can post their queries on testing and evaluation for periodical clarification, under the FAQ section. Even at the stage of pre launch testing of this website, it has got more than 10,000 hits.

The JS (L) expressed her happiness after watching all the details of the website. When asked about her comments, she replied that she would write in detail after going back to Delhi. The NTS team comprising its academic, technical, and support staff was present in full strength. Mr. Ancy Thomas and Mr. V.K.Dheerajj (JRPs Technical) who worked for developing this website took the lead for holding this event.

#### Current Activities

### Workshops on CCGS - Personality Traits

 $1^{st}$  to  $5^{th}$  July 2010

This workshop was organized in two phases one each for cognitive & psychomotor factors. The objective was to finalize the explanatory notes on the dimensions of the above factors, identified and distributed across the seven levels of general education and also to prepare illustrative examples for the same. After a detailed discussion with the Head, NTS the conceptual explanations were finalised only for the cognitive domain, and it was decided to finalise the details of psychomotor domain and to workout the illustrative examples in their respective places individually by each of the experts. 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### Workshop on Glossary & Conceptual Explanation

#### Tamil : $5^{\text{th}}$ to $9^{\text{th}}$ July 2010 and $19^{\text{th}}$ to $25^{\text{th}}$ July 2010

The first phase of the workshop was organized to finalize the explanations of the evaluation terms already prepared in Tamil through various workshops. Explanations of about 200 evaluation terms and the concepts represented by them were covered in this phase.

In the second phase of the workshop, explanations of the remaining terms were taken care of . A glossary of evaluation terms, was derived as a byproduct, of this work. Based on the modifications made in certain Tamil equivalents, the language used in the

The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> phases of the above workshop were arranged to review and finalize the glossary of evaluation terms as well as the explanations of the concepts represented by them in Kannada. Prof. C.G. Venkataramana Setty (formerly of SKMK College of Education, Mysore), and Prof. G.H.Parvathamma (formerly of University of Mysore) were involved in this work. They went through the material and made certain modifications with assistance from Mr. M.Manjunatha and Dr. S.Puttaraju (JRPs, MILES).

prefinal version of the conceptual explanations (619 pages) was cross verified and rearranged according to Tamil alphabet by Dr. K.Chidambaram, Ms. S.Shasikala (JRPs under MILES & NTS), Mr. L.B.Kishorekumar, Mr. L.R.Premkumar, Mr. S.Srinivasan, and Ms. Saranyadevi (Doctoral Fellows of NTS) in consultation with Dr. G.Sandhya Nayak (JRP, Academic).

#### Hindi : 6<sup>th</sup> July to 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2010

This workshop was organized to review and finalise the Hindi version of the explanations of the evaluation terms prepared in a series of workshops held earlier. During this programme about 1100 explanations were cross checked for their grammatical accuracy and internal consistency. Prof. Tippeswamy (formerly of University of Mysore), Dr. Rishi Bhushan Choubey and Dr. Shyama Singh (RPs, MILES) participated in the workshop.

#### Urdu: 6<sup>th</sup> July to 7<sup>th</sup> August 2010

Similar work was also undertaken for Urdu. Dr. Reyaz Ahmad, Mr. Md. Athar Hussain (MANUU, Hyderabad), Mr. Abdur Rahman Khan (formerly of DIET, Mysore), and Dr. Asma Javeria (MILES) worked for Urdu in consultation with Dr. G.M.Ansari, Dr. Md.Rizwan, Dr. Jamshed Ahmad, and Dr.Md.Saleem Ahmad (JRPs of NTS).

The above programmes were coordinated by Dr. M.Balakumar. The framework, academic guidance, and other related clarifications for all these programmes were provided by Prof. Pon Subbiah.

### Workshop on Graded Tests (Tamil)

### $15^{\mbox{\tiny th}}$ to $30^{\mbox{\tiny th}}$ July 2010

This phase of the workshop was devoted for checking the graded tests meant for Graduate to Research levels. The other details such as computer number codes for the major, minor, and sub components of language, literature and personality along with aspects tested were verified and appropriately incorporated at all the levels. As of now, the graded tests have been formulated for each of the seven levels viz., Primary, Upper Primary, Secondary, Higher Secondary, Graduate, Post Graduate and Research. Each level has got 4 sets of question papers along with answer keys i.e.  $7 \times 4 = 28$  tests with answer keys.

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The following young scholars viz., Dr. B.Vijayakumar, Dr. P.Manthiri, Dr. A.R.Muthukkaruppan, Ms. R.Thanalakshmi, Ms. S.Premavathi, Ms. G.Sudha, Ms. K.Kanagalakshmi, and Mr. P.Jeyasankar were involved in this work, apart from Ms. D.Manivasuki and Ms. V.Chellathai (JRPs, MILES) who were inducted at a later stage. Prof. R.Pannerselvam (formerly of Karnatak University, Dharward), and Dr. R.Muralidharan (Tamil University, Thanjavur), attended the programme as experts to guide the young scholars. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. G.Suseela (JRP, NTS), and assisted by Dr. B.Nehruji (RP, MILES). Mr. N.Jeykumar carried out the corrections and modifications suggested by the academic team. The material was in gradual development for nearly a decade, as per the research, design, and guidance of Prof. Pon Subbiah.

# S&D Survey and Documentation

• To collect, consolidate, and create an electronic grid of information pertaining to contents, methods, and purposes of evaluation • To enlist the contact particulars of individuals and institutions involved in preparing and using different types of tests • To develop a grid of material resources with syllabi of various courses and question papers there on, at different levels of education • To build up a specialized library with rare reference on this area and documenting various related news items

#### Current Activities

• Data entry work of NLLTs was carried out using an application software exclusively developed for this purpose. In the month of July 2010, a total of 16,514 records have been fed into the system. Among these, 9226 records are for Higher Secondary Level in three *regions* (Hindi - 4055, Tamil - 1686, Urdu - 3485) and 7,288 are for Graduate Level in three *regions* (Hindi - 3475, Tamil - 2619, Urdu - 1194). Since the data entry work (for all the answer scripts received from RFUs) was completed, the analysis of the same is being initiated by involving Dr. G.Viswanathappa (Regional Institute of Education), an expert in statistics. The analysis of the data in respect of the three languages and for two levels is in the verge of completion.

• NTS library: 21 new titles including a monthly magazine were added to the library, during the month of July 2010.

#### Current Activities

### **Review Meeting on Documentaries**

 $22^{\mbox{\tiny nd}}$  and  $23^{\mbox{\tiny rd}}$  July 2010

A two day meeting was organized at the NTS HQrs., CIIL, Mysore in connection with the documentary films. The objective of this programme was to check the relevance of the shooting scripts prepared by the producers, and finalise the same for making films.

On the first day, the scripts were presented by the producers. The members of the NTS faculty listened to them. As the shooting scripts were already discussed by the concerned team members, the required modifications were readily made available to the producers. On the second day, Prof. Pon Subbiah suggested that the documentary should have three sections viz., conceptual explanations, structural elements with examples, and their adoptability and practical usage. Also he emphasised that there should be continuity from one section to the other with proper visuals in support of the concepts verbally presented. The documentary films were expected to be completed within a couple of months.

### Current Activities

### Feedback Meeting on NLLTs

8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> July 2010

The objective of this meeting was to obtain feedback from the representatives of RFUs about the NLLTs which were recently conducted across the country. Altogether 18 members representing 13 RFUs located in Hindi and Urdu speaking regions, participated in the meeting. The programme commenced with registration of participants, at 10 am on  $8^{th}$  July 2010.

During the sessions, the participants expressed the problems encountered by them in the process of field administering the NLLTs. Many issues regarding

academic and administrative aspects were discussed with possible remedies. Apart from the Head NTS, Director i/c, CIIL, also interacted with the participants for some time.

On the second day, the staff of the Accounts Section discussed the issues related to the expenditure on NLLTs incurred by the RFUs. This facilitated the settlement of several pending bills. The Head, NTS in his valedictory address, requested the Local Coordinators of RFUs and the Heads of the Institutions (housing the RFUs) to set right the shortcomings pointed out during the discussions. They were also advised to equip themselves for the ensuing field administration of NLLTs on a larger sample for the purpose of evolving local, regional, and national norms.

Dr. V.Ilangovan(SRP) proposed vote of thanks. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Biresh Kumar (RP), and Dr. Sandhya Nayak (JRP).
