training programme on Language Evaluation was conducted in Mahatma Gandhi Institute (MGI), Moka, Mauritius from 8th to 18th January, 2008. the many activities that are undertaken as per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between CIIL and MGI. The MOU was signed with an objective of sharing the expertise developed at CIIL with the faculty of MGI in the area of teaching, learning and evaluation in language education.

The programme was inaugurated on 8th January by Shri J. R. L. Putty, the Director General of MGI & Rabindranath Tagore Institute, Mauritius. Lectures on testing and evaluation were delivered by Prof. Pon Subbiah, Head, NTS-India and on text book preparation by Dr. I.S. Borkar and Shri S. S. Yadurajan. Dr. N. Nadaraja Pillai delivered lectures on the production of audio-video materials for language teaching. Altogether twenty eight faculty members representing the departments of Chinese, Education,

The valedictory function was held in the afternoon of 18th January. Mr. P. R. Ramlugun, permanent secretary and supervising officer, Ministry of Education and Human Resource Development, Govt. of Mauritius was the chief guest. In his valedictory address, Mr. P. R. Ramlugun highlighted the significance of the MOU between CIIL and MGI. The coordinator of the programme Dr.P Tiroumalechetty presented a brief

report of the training programme-cum-workshop.

During the course of their stay, the CIIL team also met the Indian High Commissioner Shri B. Jaishankar and apprised him of the activities carried out by the CIIL for NRIs and PIOs. This included a briefing about the National Testing Service-India and its objectives.

### \*Forthcoming: First Introductory Meeting

8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> February 2008

A two day 'Introductory Meeting' of the representatives of institutions (identified for estabilishing RFUs of NTS-India) will be held at CIIL, Mysore. A total of 23 members (19 from colleges and 4 from Schools) representing 12 regions where Tamil is in active use, is expected to participate in the meeting.

### **Grant-in-Aid**

In order to encourage individuals as well as institutions involved in developing materials and imparting training in the area of testing and evaluation, the NTS-India provides lumpsum grants as per the terms and conditions specified under this sub scheme.

Accordingly, a lummpsum grant of Rs 75,000 was sanctioned to the Department of Linguistics, Tamil University, Thanjavur to conduct a workshop on 'Testing, Evaluation and Assessment for higher Secondary School Tamil Teachers'. The programme will be conducted by Dr. S. Rajendran, Professor & Head, Department of Linguistics, Tamil University, Thanjavur from 11th to 15th February, 2008. The objectives of the programme are:

- to create an awareness to the Tamil Teachers on the key principles of evaluation in language education
- to provide them the details of evaluation at the formative and summative stages of language education
- to give them practical training on the design and construction of tests besides evaluation.

A lumpsum grant of Rs 1,50,000 has been sanctioned by CIIL through the Centre for Testing & Evaluation to the department of English Language Teaching (ELT), Gauhati University, Guwahati, to conduct a two day National Seminar followed by a two day workshop on 'Language Pedagogy. The programmes are scheduled to be held from 26.03.08 to 27.03.08 and 28.03.08 to 29.-3.08 respectively. The objectives of these programmes are:

- to create an awareness on the changing scenario for the need of languages, particularly English
- to provide both regional and national perspectives on the teaching of languages
- to bridge the gap between theory and practice while imparting the langauge
- to understand language teaching needs & issues, in the North East
- to evolve a set of guidelines as recommendations for the teaching of English
- to discuss the issues and challenges in English language teaching at school and college levels
- to evolve strategies for the effective use of ELT methodology with the changing needs for English

The outcome of the programme will be relevant to the teachers of other languages too. The programme will be conducted by Dr. Anita Tamuli, Head, Dept of ELT, Gauhati University, Guwahati.
