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NTS-India: A Great Mission to Fulfill the Evaluation Requirements of the Country - Prof. V.C.Kulandaiswamy

National Testing Service-India (NTS-I) organized a convention on testing and evaluation at the University of Madras (UOM), Chennai. This was a follow up programme. The earlier one was held in the IIMC, JNU campus, New Delhi in the month of February. About 150 scholars representing the higher educational institutions located in

the Metropolitan city of Chennai attended the convention. Prof. V.C.Kulandaiswamy (Former VC, IGNOU & the chief guest of the function) inaugurated the programme at 10 am on 7th May 2009 in the Senate Hall of the UOM.

In his inaugural address, Prof. V.C. Kulandaiswamy emphasised the importance of evaluation and expressed his concern over the current state of affairs. He said that the objectives of education was to develop certain knowledge, competencies, and values in the individual. If these objectives were not evaluated accurately, the work would not be completed. He made a reference about the knowledge era and its impact on the social, economic, and political developments of the country. While referring to the activities of NTS, he expressed his confidence that NTS would bring a better and uniform evaluation system throughout the country. He further added that fulfilling the evaluation

requirements of the country is a gigantic task and to accomplish this great mission the scholars should give their inputs. He also released the draft version of the Concept based Continuum of Graded Syllabi (CCGS) materials - one each for Language and Literature covering all the seven levels of education viz., primary, upper primary, secondary, higher secondary, graduate, post graduate, and research developed by NTS after decades of R&D.

Prof. Pon Subbiah (Head, NTS) introduced the objectives and activities of the NTS as part of his keynote address. He explained the need for taking up the task of evolving norms and establishing benchmarks so that they could serve as reference points for evaluating courses, institutions, and individuals at various levels of education. He also briefed about the activities undertaken through the task groups. Further, the twin objectives of the convention viz., dissemination of information and building up of consensus on the conceptual framework on assessing Aptitude, Achievement, and Proficiency were also introduced.

Prof. S. Ramachandran (Vice Chancellor, UOM) in his presidential address shared his experience with the audience about his visit to NTS during December 2008. He recalled his interaction with the Head and the staff of NTS on a variety of issues concerning the system of testing and evaluation being practised in the country. He stressed the need to create an awareness about the activities of NTS in general and the universal applicability of the CCGS materials. He hoped that the programme would help to create an impact on the entire system of education and assured that the UOM would collaborate with NTS-India by opening a Regional Field Unit of NTS in its campus.

Prof. M. Ranganatham (Registrar, UOM & special invitee of the programme) pointed out the need for a review of the system of evaluation. He conveyed that the instruments used for evaluation should be credible, valid, and reliable when applied on a large scale population. He was of the opinion that there is a need for improving and standardizing the evaluation and that NTS was doing a great service to the nation. He assured full support and cooperation of UOM.

Earlier Prof. M.R.Srinivasan (Dean-Academic, UOM) welcomed the gathering and introduced the dignitaries to the audience. NTS staff felicitated the Chief Guest, the President, and Special Invitee of the function. Dr. M.Balakumar (Coordinator, NTS Programmes) delivered the vote of thanks and the inaugural function concluded with the National Anthem.

After tea break, the Head, NTS made an elaborate (power point) presentation about the salient features of NTS-I and its RFUs. He explained the details of the background work which led to the development of Multipurpose Indian Language Evaluation System (MILES) and subsequently the NTS, along with the methodologies adopted for achieving that. Following this, the website (of the Centre for Testing & Evaluation) was demonstrated by Mr. Ancy Thomas and Mr. V. K. Dheerajj (JRPs-Tech). During the post lunch session, the Head, NTS continued his briefing about the Retrieval Facility developed under MILES. Mr. K.S.Raghavan and Ms. R.Kavitha (JRPs-Tech) demonstrated the Application Software developed for this purpose. The process of instant construction of tests in language and literature (for Higher Secondary and Graduate levels) was highlighted and samples produced. Subsequently, the issues related were discussed and debated by the scholars under the chairmanship of Prof. A. Panneerselvam (Former Director of Teacher Education, Govt. of Tamil Nadu). The queries of the

participants were also clarified. The first day's programme was concluded at 5.00 pm with the formation of three groups (each with 45 to 50 members) - one each for Aptitude, Achievement, and Proficiency tests.

The second day's programme was devoted for group work. Each group was led by a Chairperson and a Convener chosen from the participants. A senior member representing the NTS/CIIL coordinated the respective group. The draft frames developed by the NTS were distributed among the members of the groups with a request to comment upon them. Separate questionnaires were supplied to each individual for obtaining feedback. The members were also requested to prepare question items on various components of the concepts of Aptitude, Achievement and Proficiency in the disciplines represented by them.

The programme concluded at 5.00 pm on 8th May '09.

Current Activities

6th Phase of Workshop on Concept based Continuum of Graded Syllabi (CCGS)

1st to 5th May 2009

The objective of the five day programme was to check the distribution of sub components of language & literature in the CCGS and to finalise it for the purpose of releasing the same at the convention scheduled to be held at the University of Madras, Chennai to get feedback from wider audience. This phase of the programme was held at the NTS H.Qrs, CIIL, Mysore. Prof. P.Ratnasabapathy (Counsellor, TIERA, Chennai), Prof. A.A.Manavalan (Former HOD of Tamil, University of Madras, Chennai), Prof. M.Suseela (Former HOD of Linguistics, Tamil

University, Thanjavur), Dr. N.Nadaraja Pillai (Former Controller of Examinations, CIIL, Mysore), and Dr. Brunda Ravikumar (Lecturer, PSG College of Arts & Science, Coimbatore) participated in the workshop. After a lengthy deliberation a few modifications were suggested by these scholars, which after due consideration were incorporated. Similarly, a few changes in the dimensions were also made after a thorough discussion. These modifications have contributed for the enrichment of the materials. Simultaneously the dimensional factors too were cross checked with reference to all the educational levels and prepared illustrative examples for the dimensions which were complex in nature. Necessary assistance was rendered by the academic staff of the NTS. Overall guidance was provided by Prof. Pon Subbiah (Head, NTS) and the programme was coordinated by Dr. M.Balakumar (RRO, CIIL).

Current Activities

NTS-India has been disseminating information about its activities through the NTS Newsletters, Websites, in addition to the press. As a result, like minded intelligentsia from different walks of life approach the NTS for various updates. Accordingly, the group working on information dissemination has been constantly engaged in updating its database with additional information pertaining to individuals and institutions to have a comprehensive database. Mr. K.S. Raghavan and Ms. R. Kavitha (JRPs-Tech) are continuously working on it.

The classified mail list includes the addresses of Members and Officials of different Councils, Commissions, Boards, Judiciary, Universities, Specialised Institutions, Insitutions of National Importance, Professional Institutions, and Govt. Depts. The current additions include the relevant officers of MHRD, Academics from RIEs, Autonomous Colleges, Technocrats from Local District Offices, Public Sector Undertakings like BHEL, IOC, Small Industries Corporation, Scientists from Research Laboratories, etc. The task of collecting the Objectives and Activities of Specialised Institutions and their Social Relevance has also been taken up. Ms. Shaistha Anjum and Mr. T.S. Phaniraj (DEOs) are assisting the technical team for inputting the information.

Current Activities

4th Introductory meeting for the representatives of the Institutions identified for RFUs

27th & 28th May 2009

A two day Introductory Meeting for the representatives of the institutions identified for establishing RFUs of NTS was conducted at the NTS H.Qrs, CIIL, Mysore. 14 representatives from 7 regions of the country participated in the programme. The main objective of the meeting was to give a briefing about the activities (both academic & administrative) to be undertaken by the RFUs.

The meeting started at 10 a.m. on 27th May '09. The participants introduced themselves and the institutions they represented. CT&E Information Brochure, MILES & NTS writeups and other relevant materials were provided to them. Documentary film on CIIL and rough cut of the NTS documentary on Achievement and Proficiency Tests were shown to them. The feedback from the participants was also obtained. In the afternoon session, the Head, NTS interacted with them on all related aspects.

In the second day forenoon, the details of activities that are expected to be carried out by the RFUs and their other responsibilities were explained by Head, NTS. The queries raised by the participants were also clarified. Subsequently, the agreement documents were supplied to them for necessary endorsement.

Prof. Udaya Narayana Singh (Director, CIIL) addressed the gathering in the afternoon. He stressed the importance of testing and evaluation and also the role and responsibility of the RFUs which are going to serve as a major hub of academic activities in their respective regions.

Each of the participant was provided with a copy of the book 'An Introduction to Evaluation Terminology' published by the Institute. The programme was coordinated by Mr. M.Saravana (SRP) and Dr. R.C.Maurya (RP) of NTS.

What does it mean?

Achievement Age (AA) is the level of the educational development of an individual. It is determined by comparing one's score (on an achievement test) with the average score of individuals of the same chronological age. Some scholars regard it as *Educational Age* and some as *Age Equivalent*.

Assessing Personality through Literature

These volumes highlight the concept of *contents in assessing personality through literature*. Scores of question (item) resources included here are constituent models for the construction of tests and examinations of varying lengths and difficulty levels. These items could be used as a tool for collecting and quantifying the details of personality factors (behavioural traits) acquired as part of all-round growth towards making objective assessment. Being built up on a dimensional problem, every item is presented in an Item File Card format with bilingual instructions. The item resources are prepared on each of the sub components and are hierarchically listed under *cognitive, affective*, and *psychomotor* domains as prescribed in the Taxonomy of Educational Objectives. They are intended to assess the all-round growth of a person in all its dimensions with sampling error free content coverage (drawn from genesis, generics, aesthetics, and affectives areas of *literature*). The introductory part includes a discussion on theoretical premises as well. This pioneering work in Indian Languages will be an indispensable companion to all those who want to construct personality tests in literature at various levels of education.
