Yes, the program significantly contributed to fulfilling the objectives of NEP-2020 by emphasizing holistic and multidisciplinary learning. It encouraged the use of mother tongue and experiential approaches to enhance conceptual understanding. The integration of technology and competency-based assessment fostered creativity, critical thinking, and inclusive education aligned with NEP-2020 goals.

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The workshop commenced at 10:00 a.m. with an introduction by Sri Pramod Kumar Dakua, Principal of DIET, followed by a welcome speech by Dr. Sanjaya Kumar Bag, Principal, ERLC, Bhubaneswar, CIIL. The Presidential cum Inaugural Address was delivered by Purna Chandra Shetty, District Educational Officer,

highlighting the objectives and significance of the programme. Ms. Bharati Tudu, Assistant Director, TE & SCERT, Odisha, felicitated the programme, emphasizing areas for teachers that align with NEP 2020. Sri Anandi Charan Bindhani, the former Principal of DIET, delivered the vote of thanks, marking the end of the inaugural session.

The first academic session was conducted by Ms Bharati Tudu, focused on the National Education Policy 2020/NCF 2023. The session significantly contributed to fulfilling the objectives of NEP-2020 by emphasizing holistic and multidisciplinary learning. It encouraged the use of mother tongue and experiential approaches to enhance conceptual understanding. The integration of technology and competency-based assessment has fostered creativity, critical thinking, and inclusive education, aligning with the goals of NEP-2020.

In the afternoon session, Ms. Champabati Hansda presented her thoughts on Taxonomy of Educational Objectives, followed by Mr. Buddhadev Biswas on basic concepts of Testing and Evaluation. The day concluded at 5:10 p.m. with participants actively engaged in discussions and activities.

The second day on 24/09/2025 began at 10:00 a.m. with two sessions, one led by Ms. Anima Baskey, covering “How to teach Language in a Classroom” and Dr. Jatindra Besra, who concluded the second Session by covering “How to teach Literature in a classroom”.

After a lunch break from 1:15 p.m. to 2:15 p.m., the afternoon session featured Dr. Kalyani Pradhan discussed subjective item types. The final session of the day was conducted by Dr. Sanjaya Kumar Bag, focused on the Objective item types. The day’s sessions were interactive and ensured continuity in the learning process.

The third day 25/09/2025 commenced at 9:30 a.m. with Dr. Pitambar Behera lecturing on “Use of Technology for Language Teachers.” He focused on the use of technology, which enables language teachers to create interactive, engaging, and learner-centered classrooms. Digital tools such as audio-visual aids, language apps, and online platforms enhance communication skills and support personalized learning.

The second session was conducted by Buddhadev Biswas, who introduced CIIL and NTS-I, and guided participants through offline question item practice. It continued after the lunch break from 2:15 p.m. to create offline objective-type questions.

The valedictory session commenced at 4:00 p.m., with a welcome address by Dr. Sanjay Kumar Bag, Principal, ERLC, Bhubaneswar, CIIL, and was chaired by Sri Pramod Kumar Dakua, Principal of DIET, and Bharati Tudu, Assistant Director, TE & SCERT, Odisha. Feedback was shared by participants, including Smt. Gumdi Baskey, Monoranjan Hansdah, and Salhai Tudu.

The workshop concluded at 5:30 p.m., marking the end of a productive and interactive three-day programme. The three-day workshop, held in Mayurbhanj, witnessed the enthusiastic participation of 45 teachers from secondary and higher secondary schools, who engaged wholeheartedly in lectures, discussions, and hands-on practice. We collected 45 sets of different objective types of question items.

The sessions provided both practical and theoretical knowledge on assessment, question item preparation, and evaluation strategies. The programme successfully aligned with the objectives of NEP 2020, fostering professional growth, interactive learning, and practical application for the teaching community. The participants expressed that such programmes are highly beneficial and recommended that they be conducted in offline mode for at least three days in the future to allow for more extensive training and practice.
